Dear Mr. President:

I write to request that you consider including Purnima Voria as part of your delegation to India when you travel there in March 2006.

Ms. Voria is the founder and president of the Denver-based National U.S. India Chamber of Commerce (NUICC), which promotes international business and trade between the U.S. and India. She was recently appointed to the 2005 Presidential Business Commission and serves as the Honorary Chairman for the National Republican Congressional Business Advisory Council. She also serves on Colorado Governor Owens's Asian Advisory Council, Denver Mayor Hickenlooper's Asian Advisory Council, the Chamber of Americas, and the Asian Chamber of Commerce.

After leading a successful trip to India in December 2005 with 20 students from the University of Denver's Daniels School of Business, Ms. Voria is now planning a trade mission to India this month for 22 of Colorado's prominent business leaders as well as for the University of Colorado's Vice Chancellor and former Ambassador Gail Schoettler.

I believe Ms. Voria's participation in your delegation to India – given her wealth of experience in India and knowledge of and contacts in the U.S. and Indian business communities – could be invaluable.
